- II. Roll Call- 21/25 Personal Privilege Sen. Ramsey 4:40, 20/25, Personal Privilege Jacobs 19/25.

III. Open Forum

- a. IT Services Consultants- Here to asses overall IT organization. Are here to better the student experience in relation to IT at the University. What was your experience getting connected? International students have experienced trouble with logins. Rogue routers are an issue. A reliable source of Wi-Fi can be difficult to come to. Sometimes hotspots are used by our students on campus. Many international students use WhatsApp. The student helpdesk in the library is a helpful resource. Labs with thicker walls are an issue for Wi-Fi. D2L could be better utilized.
- b. Board of Trustees Updates-Student Trustee Cristopher Santana-
 - I. Audit Committee- Policy to develop policy because the committee is new. Did an open records policy. Chief of police position will be searched for soon. No major findings. Hacker got

- into payroll and snagged about \$7000, but we were able to recover about half. We have an amazing audit team.
- II. Administrative Committee- Decreased out of state tuition for QCOM last meeting. Campus living is increasing in cost, but they are not increasing very much. They keep the cost competitive. They understand the students are unhappy with required meal plans with certain housing options. Faculty salary was recommended a 2.5% increase. Tuition is not increasing by too much. The Wellness fee, concert fee, and technology fee are coming along nicely.
- III. Executive Committee- Appeal by Dr. Anthony Mosino. His appeal was denied.
- IV. Academic Committee- Looking into having a new sport.Acrobatics and tumbling look to be favorites.
- V. President's report- It is time to step back and reevaluate our goals. We need to look nationally on goals. We are number one in six-year graduation rate.

IV. Old Business

- a. BucFund- Starting balance about \$70,000
 - I. Patchwork Players- Requested \$1,500, received ineligible due to lack of proper time to process travel application, as specified in the SGA SOP.

- II. MSWSA- Requested \$1,397, received \$1,400. 20-0-0 PASSED
- III. SOFA- Requested \$6,054, received \$6,060. Sen. E. Patel, questioned the room situation. Sen. Smith, the rooms are cheaper this way. The workshops that they put on after the event have experienced success in the past. Concerns about cost were raised, but the impressive history of results of this event have merit.

The group was VERY well prepared. 17-3-0 PASS

- b. SSR-20-002- Closed Captioning- Committee remarks added section 2B passed 5-0-1. Felt like it should pass immediately. Sen. Bass, our hearing impaired and international students need to be able to understand our videos. PASSED 19-0-0
- c. SSR-20-003- Religious Accommodation- We went ahead and worked with the administration on this policy. This is primarily to more solidly voice our support. Committee thought the legislation was fair passed 4-0-0. The appeals process will protect students that feel wronged.
