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


Monthly Temperature Summary:

Temperatures for the month of June were above normal in most of the state. Mean temperatures ranged from 82°F in the Memphis area, to 57°F in the highest elevations of the Smokies. A few areas in the mountains of East Tennessee and along the southern Cumberland Plateau did record mean temperatures 1 to 2.5°F below normal. The highest temperature anomalies were recorded in Knoxville and the Nashville Metro Areas, with 5-6°F and 4-5°F above normal conditions observed, respectively. Heat advisories were common in West Tennessee, especially in the second half of the month, and heat indices topped 110°F in some locations!



Monthly Precipitation Summary:

Most areas of the state recorded normal to above normal precipitation for the month; however, most of that precipitation was associated with thunderstorm complexes, meaning fast and heavy bursts of rain with long dry periods in between. For the first week of the month, heavier precipitation was concentrated in the western half of the state. Then for the middle two weeks, the southern and western parts of the state recorded high rainfall totals. Then the eastern half of the state recorded torrential rains in the last week of the month; with totals on the northern plateau in excess of 8 inches in some places. The driest part of the state was southwest Shelby County, where rainfall for the month was only 40-50% of normal, and D0 drought conditions spilled over from Arkansas.




Drought Monitor:

June started with no observed drought conditions in the state of Tennessee, and in the second week of the month, a small area of D0 (abnormally dry) conditions were reported in southwest Shelby County. A drying trend occurred in large areas of northern and eastern Tennessee, with below normal precipitation and above normal temperature conditions, culminating in D0 conditions being declared at the beginning of the last week of the month. However, heavy rains in those areas in the following days eased drought concerns for most of the affected area heading into July.



Soil Moisture:

Soil moisture was above 500 mm for almost all areas of the state at the end of June, with slightly positive anomalies (above normal conditions) as well.




Streamflow:

Stream flow averaged over the month shows all streams at or above normal flow levels, however at times many streams in the eastern part of the state were below normal. The heavy rains of the last few days of June put many streams much above normal for the last week, alleviating below normal observations in the earlier parts of the month.

Map of monthly streamflow compared to historical streamflow for the month of the year (Tennessee)









Map of 7-day average streamflow compared to historical streamflow for the day of the year (Tennessee)




Miscellaneous:

Crop Conditions from USDA: Most crops were at or above 5-year average progress during the last week of the month. Additionally, most crops were in fair to excellent condition. Pastures recorded the most negative condition percentages, with 10% in poor to very poor condition, mainly due to highly variable rainfall in different parts of the state, and high temperatures.


Fire Danger: The Interagency Fire Center forecasts all of Tennessee, and the southeast, to have below normal potential for significant wildland fire for the month of July.




Storm of the month:

The main weather story of the month for Tennessee was the numerous days of severe thunderstorms. Most notably would be the two derecho events that occurred on the 28th that swept through Tennessee from north to south producing 72 wind damage reports and spawning 1 tornado.

A derecho is defined as a widespread, long-lived wind storm. Derechos are associated with bands of rapidly moving showers or thunderstorms variously known as bow echoes, squall lines, or quasi-linear convective systems. There were two derechos that occurred on the 28th, one started mid-day in Tennessee, and then moved south through Alabama all the way to the northern Gulf Coast of Alabama and Florida, and a second started in Eastern Nebraska and then moved south into western areas of Tennessee in the evening/nighttime hours producing more wind damage reports, although the system weakened over the state.





The severe storms that formed the first derecho also produced the tornado in Hickman County, near the Duck River, which had winds estimated up to 110mph, making it a strong EF1 tornado. This was the first reported tornado in the state of Tennessee since March 17th of this year, ending a streak of 103 days without a tornado. No tornado was reported in Tennessee for the entire Spring (March 21-June 21).





Storm reports:


At least 17 days during the month had reports of severe weather events. With a total of 1 tornado, 16 reports of severe hail (\geq 1" diameter), and 206 reports of wind damage. June 28th was the day with the most reports, with 1 tornado and 72 wind reports.
















CPC outlooks for the next month:

The climate prediction center outlooks for July indicate that eastern Tennessee, especially southeast TN will record above normal precipitation for the month. Western TN is between the area of forecasted above normal precipitation to its east, and forecasted below normal precipitation to its west, and has equal chances of observing above/below/normal conditions.

Temperature outlooks indicate that the entire eastern half of the US will be above normal for July, with the highest confidence in the northeast.
