VUB Spring Semester Information and Instructions

Page three of the newsletter contains the Veterans Upward Bound (VUB) 2018 Spring Semester schedule of classes. It is very similar to previous semesters and it contains all the precollege class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for entrance into and success in a postsecondary program.

We will continue our basic math and English classes this semester by offering tutoring for those who need to brush up on their basic skills. Please call the VUB office to arrange this

individual service. We will continue to provide tutoring for those who need additional preparation before taking the college assessment and placement exam.

Please note that computer skills class meets twice per week, while the remainder (science and statistics) meets only once per week. Also note that the semester is ten weeks in length.

Check out the schedule and contact any VUB staff member if you have questions or to register for classes.

We recommend that all participants register for at least two courses. This will allow you to receive the full benefit of the instruction and be better prepared when you enter a postsecondary program.

We have designed the schedule so you will be able to register for up to four different classes during a four-day period without class conflicts.

If you are in college already, keep us informed of your progress, call if you need help, and let us know if you change your address or phone number.

NAVUB Scholarship Winner



Congratulations to Ms. Devanie Dishner, VUB participant and current Northeast State Community College (NSCC) sophomore for winning the 2017 National Association of Veterans Upward Bound (NAVUB) Combat Tracker Scholarship in the amount of \$2,000. The scholarship is named in honor of the Combat Tracker Units of the Viet Nam War, that consisted of five-six men and a Labrador Retriever. Their mission was to reestablish contact with the enemy, reconnaissance and finding missing personnel.

After graduation from high school in 2007, Ms. Dishner enlisted in Army and

Army National Guard and served honorably three years. While in service, she advanced to the rank of SPC E4, received the National Defense Service Medal, and the Army Service Ribbon.

Ms. Dishner learned about the VUB program through the VA's Vocational Rehabilitation & Employment program and joined in February 2016. The staff provided assistance in preparing for college which included assessments, tutoring, financial aid information and college entrance assistance. She followed through with all the requirements and suggestions by the staff and enrolled at NSCC in fall 2016.

Her college major is Secondary Education and her hope is to get a licensure in education so she can teach at a local school. She is scheduled to graduate from NSCC August 2018 and plans to transfer to ETSU.

Very few veterans begin college with the determination, positive attitude, and success as she has. The VUB Staff wishes Ms. Dishner success in her college program and her future career.

Financial Literacy Information

Student Loans

If you've explored grant and scholarship possibilities and still find yourself still falling short of what you need to pay for school, a student loan can make the difference. They offer lower interest rates than many other financing options and many students wouldn't be able to afford college without them.

There are different kinds of student loans. Some are based on financial need, some aren't, but one thing most of them have in common is that you must be in school at least half-time while using the money. If your class load falls under half of a full time load, you will have to start repaying the money immediately.

- **Unsubsidized Stafford Loans.** These loans are not restricted by income and have a fixed interest rate. These loans accrue interest while you are in school (though the payments can be deferred and added to the principal after graduation).
- **Subsidized Stafford Loans.** These are need-based, have a fixed interest rate and the federal government pays interest while you are in school and during a six-month grace period after graduation.
- **Perkins Loans.** These federal loans—which are available for both undergraduate and graduate students—are reserved for students who demonstrate an “exceptional financial need.” While they have lower overall limits than other federal loan options, the other terms of the Perkins Loan (interest rate, grace period, fees, and repayment options) are the most generous.
- **The Federal Parent PLUS Loans.** This program offers loans for parents to pay for their child's college education at a fixed interest rate with flexible repayment options. They're not based on income or assets and can be used to cover all college costs, minus other financial aid.
- **Bank Loans.** If federal student loans and other aid aren't enough to cover all the costs of college, a private student loan could help. Private student loans may offer a better interest rate than using credit cards to pay for education-related expenses and they can be an alternative to leveraging home equity, savings, or investments.
