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

VUB Summer Semester Information and Instructions

Page three of the newsletter contains the VUB 2016 Summer Semester schedule of classes. It is very similar to previous semesters and it contains all the precollege class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for entrance into and success in a postsecondary program.

We will continue our basic math and English classes this semester by offering tutoring for those who need to brush up on their basic skills. Please call the VUB office to arrange this individual service. We will continue to provide tutoring for those who need additional preparation before taking the COMPASS test.

Please note that computer skills class meets twice per week, while the remainder (algebra, science, and stats) meets only once per week. Also note that the semester is nine weeks in length.

Check out the schedule and contact any VUB staff member if you have questions. You may register by phone.

We recommend that all participants register for at least two courses so that you will receive the full benefit of the instruction and be better prepared when you enter a postsecondary program.

We have designed the schedule so you will be able to register for up to four different classes during а four-day period without class conflicts.

National Association Veterans Upward Bound Success Story



Following his 1978 gradfrom uation Daniel Boone High School in Grav, Tennessee, Charles R. Patton enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps. His career spanned 23 years with service throughout the United States and around the world. During his military service he held positions in a variety of fields, attended several military instruction programs, and rose to the

rank of Master Sergeant, E-8. Being awarded the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy-Marine Corps Commendation Medal, Navy Achievement Medal, and Recruiter of the Year Award exemplify his outstanding service performance, devotion to duty, and potential for higher education.

Upon retirement from the Marines, Mr. Patton became aware of the Veterans Upward Bound (VUB) Program at East Tennessee State University (ETSU) and after discussing the benefits of the program with the VUB Counselor, he decided to join. He was administered academic assessments and considering he had received some post-secondary courses while in the military, it was determined that his academic ability was sufficient to reach his educational goals.

In 2002, Mr. Patton entered Northeast State Technical Community College (NSTCC). A short time later he was employed at ETSU as a technical clerk which began a significant and interesting career. While working full time, he was able to continue his college program. He completed the requirements in 2004, for an Associate of Science graduating Summa Cum Laude and in 2007, he graduated from ETSU and received a Bachelor of Business Administration.

As an employee, Mr. Patton has served as a member on the President's Council, Senior Staff Council, Information Technology Governance Committee, Security Subcommittee, and others. He served in leadership positions as Staff Senate President and currently as the Chairman of the ETSU Veterans

Affairs Standing Committee which he has held for six years. He also was selected as the College of Public Health Staff Employee of the Year.

Regarding the support received from VUB, Mr. Patton related, "While I was going through my degree program I spoke with the VUB Counselor from time to time. He was an absolute source of reference anytime I needed to navigate information concerning academic support."
