Page three of the newsletter contains the Veterans Upward Bound (VUB) 2022 Summer Semester schedule of classes. Some of our pre-college classes are taught online using Comfit[®] and Zoom but they still contain all the pre-college class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for entrance into and success in a postsecondary program.

We will continue to offer math and English

tutoring for those who need to brush up on their basic skills.

We also provide tutoring using Comfit[®] online tutoring system for those who need additional preparation before taking the college assessment and placement exam.

Our Zoom[®] tutoring sessions in math, English, and computer skills are taught by Dr. Marian Young. They are offered on Tuesday and Thursday evenings

7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Computer skills class and other pre-college classes meet once a week for the nine-week semester.

SAEOPP Scholarship Winner



The Veterans Upward Bound (VUB) staff would like to congratulate Ms. Helena Ritz for being selected as a winner of a Southern Association of Educational Opportunity Program Personnel (SAEOPP) scholarship in the amount of \$1,000. She is working toward a bachelor's degree in social work and hopes to help veterans as a social worker.

Helena is a disabled Navy veteran. She joined the Navy March 20, 1980, at Lakewood, California, and entered

boot camp in Orlando, Florida. Her first duty station was Fighter Squadron 43 out of Oceana, Virginia where she worked on the flight line as an A-4F plane captain. Over the next few years, she was stationed with the Air Test and Evaluation Squadron out of Point Mugu, California where she worked testing aircraft's abilities. She left active service on October 30, 1993.

A few years ago, Helena began thinking about starting another career and she wanted it to be one which she could be passionate about and not just a job. To start this new career, she knew she would need to return to school and reached out to VUB where she was guided through the process of applying for federal financial aid, veterans benefits, and enrolling in ETSU. She also participated in academic tutoring to be prepared to begin classes in spring 2020.

Helena is doing well and has been on ETSU's Dean's List several times over the last few semesters. The VUB staff wishes Helena all the best in her college career.

In Memory of Bernard Wilson



The Veterans Upward Bound family is heartbroken to hear of the passing of one of our most beloved and longest participating veterans. Bernard Wilson was found at his home in Johnson City, TN on the 6th of November 2021. He was born in Shelby County, Memphis, TN on the 12th of January 1953 and joined the U.S. Navy (submarine service) on March 27, 1973, where he served with honor. Bernard was always smiling and each time he came

into the office his happiness and sunny disposition would infect everyone. He would often have a humorous story to tell about something that had happened to him recently or a story about something that had happened many years before on “his” submarine.

Bernard joined our programs on the 21st of September 2005, and after attending several of our pre-college classes, he enrolled in a program of study at Northeast State Community College where he hoped to finish his degree in general education. At the time of his death, he was taking care of two of his young grandsons and had planned on returning to school. The staff of Veterans Upward Bound will miss Bernard and his weekly calls where he would ask “Where’s Joan?”

Financial Literacy Information

Mortgage Assistance

General Guidance

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs urges all veterans who are encountering problems making their mortgage payments to speak with their loan servicers as soon as possible to explore options to avoid foreclosure. Contrary to popular opinion, servicers really do not want to foreclose because foreclosure costs a lot of money. Depending on a veteran's specific situation, servicers may offer any of the following options to avoid foreclosure:

- Repayment Plan – The borrower makes regular installments each month plus part of the missed installments.
- Special Forbearance – The servicer agrees not to initiate foreclosure to allow time for borrowers to repay the missed installments. An example would be when a borrower is waiting for a tax refund.
- Loan Modification - Provides the borrower a fresh start by adding the delinquency to the loan balance and establishing a new payment schedule.
- Additional time to arrange a private sale – The servicer agrees to delay foreclosure to allow a sale to close if the loan will be paid off.
- Short Sale – When the servicer agrees to allow a borrower to sell his/her home for a lesser amount than what is currently required to payoff the loan.
- Deed-in-Lieu of Foreclosure - The borrower voluntarily agrees to deed the property to the servicer instead of going through a lengthy foreclosure process.

Veterans with VA-Guaranteed Home Loans

The servicer has the primary responsibility of servicing the loan to resolve the default. However, in cases where the servicer is unable to help the veteran borrower, Loan Guaranty has loan technicians in eight regional loan centers and a special servicing center who take an active role in interceding with the servicer to explore all options to avoid foreclosure. Service members or veterans with VA-guaranteed home loans can call (877) 827-3702 to reach the nearest Loan Guaranty office where loan specialists are prepared to discuss potential ways to help save the loan.

Veterans with non-VA Guaranteed Home Loans

For a veteran or service member who may have obtained a conventional or sub-prime loan, VA does not have the legal authority to intervene on the borrower's behalf. It is imperative that a borrower contacts his/her servicer as quickly as possible.
