Bound Annual Banquet was held on December 1, 2005. VUB participants, college achievers, supporters, and staff gathered to participate in the recognition and honoring of our students' progress as well as to celebrate another year of VUB success. More than fifty persons attended and enjoyed good food, fun and fellowship.

All of our participants attending the ceremony were recognized and received a Certificate of Participation and their Fall Semester grade reports. Seven college achievers attended, were recognized, and congratulated for their progress and success. Eight VUB staff members and instructors were present as well as several special guests of staff, participants, and college achievers.

Of particular note was the attendance of Dr. Chris Lefler, who was the first VUB Director at East Tennessee State University beginning in 1980. Also in attendance was Ms. Paula White, a former Assistant Director of VUB.

Len Morrison, Assistant Director of VUB, provided highlights of the recently submitted Annual Performance Report and updates in the operation of the program. It was noted that all performance objectives were met or exceeded. All student academic performance goals, program continuation and completion goals, and college entrance, retention, and graduation goals were exceeded.

Also noted were the achievements of Theresa Flynn, a National Honor Society inductee and Mike Morgan, winner of three scholarships and last year's Polly Archer Award.

Spring Semester Info

Spring is just a few weeks away and we are preparing for another great opportunity for our VUB participants. We are expecting many of our Fall Semester students to continue through the Spring Semester in preparation for postsecondary entry and we will have several veterans who will be entering the pre-college preparation phase of the program.

Please note that if you register for classes you are also invited to attend our orientation program which will be held on January 25, 2006, at 5:00 P.M. The orientation program will be held in ETSU's Main Meal Private Dining Room in the Culp Center. The purpose of orientation is to provide an opportunity to meet with VUB staff and instructors, learn more about opportunities available, and provide an opportunity for questions.

Polly Archer Winner

Congratulations to Rebecca White for being selected as the ninth recipient of the VUB Polly Archer Award. This award is given to the most outstanding VUB academic college student for the previous academic year.



Rebecca's performance for the 2004-2005 Academic Year was nothing short of amazing. She carried 51 credit hours, made the Dean's List all three semesters and had an academic year GPA of 3.894. Her selection brought with it a \$50 gift certificate, an ETSU pen and pencil set and having her name engraved on the VUB Polly Archer Award Honors Plaque which is on display in the ETSU Culp Center's TRiO Office.

When Rebecca first came to VUB in September 1997, she was a single parent and a recently discharged USAF veteran. Upon completing VUB pre-college classes she enrolled at ETSU summer of 1998 and graduated with

an A.S. in Medical Lab Technology with a GPA of 3.739 in May 1999.

Following graduation she took a fiveyear break in her education program, during which she married, had a second child and made the decision to reenter ETSU to seek her B.S. in Nursing. She reenrolled in January of 2004 and made the Dean's List every semester she was eligible. Also, she was 1st runner-up for last year's Polly Archer Award.

On December 17th Rebecca accomplished her goals by graduating with a 3.882 GPA and being hired at the Johnson City Medical Center in the Stroke Prevention and Rehabilitation Department. Way to go Rebecca!!!

The 1st runner-up of the Award was Jaime McManus, a USAF Veteran and an ETSU Graduate with a B.S. in Biology. The 2nd runner-up was Mike Krohn, a USA Veteran and a freshman at NSTCC.

Scholarship Information for VUB

Veterans who are or will be attending postsecondary education programs (colleges, technical, and vocational schools) may apply for the following scholarships. Only "older" students will be in competition for these awards and need not meet the same criteria that are required of recently graduated high school students. Checks are often paid directly to the veteran which means the amount does not reduce other financial aid awards.

Tennessee Association of Special Programs (TASP) - ETSU Vets have a VERY high success rate of winning this award -\$400, deadline: on/about October 15th.

Southern Association of Education Opportunity Program Personnel (SAEOPP) -\$600 up to \$1000, deadline: on/about December 1st.

National Association of Veterans Upward Bound Personnel Program (NAVUBPP) -\$500 award, deadline: on/about April 1st.

Typical matters that are considered are: community involvement; honors and awards received; letters of recommendation; and essays such as "How Veterans Upward Bound has made it possible for me to pursue a college, Vocational/Technical Education".

The selection criteria are similar, so it is easy to apply for several scholarships. The ETSU – VUB staff will assist veterans who wish to apply. Deadline dates may change so inquire a.s.a.p. and obtain your application package from your support personnel soon. Earlier deadlines for local consideration may be established so we can have time to assist our candidate with the final application process.

Someone will get the cash. Several VUB College Achievers have been winners. The next winner may be you. Your VUB staff will be happy to assist with the process.

However, Mike plans to earn a Ph.D. in psychology and become a high school counselor.
