National Association of Veterans Upward Bound Project Personnel (NAVUBPP) Scholarship Winner



Two years ago truck driver Mike Krohn stopped in at the Veterans Upward Bound office at East Tennessee State University in Kingsport to prepare himself to enter Northeast State Technical Community College. To date he has won two scholarships worth \$900 and achieved a perfect GPA of 4.0 (all A's) on his way to a Bachelor's Degree in Medical Laboratory Technology.

After four years of service in the Army, and non-rewarding employment, Mike had been out of school for twenty years and admitted possible difficulties in English, math and science. He was placed in the pre-college preparation classes for two semesters and he not only earned an "A" in each class completed, but he also raised his achievement and proficiency in these subjects to college level. He says Veterans

Upward Bound helped him build his selfconfidence and to overcome the intimidating collegiate environment. He also says that the program helped him open doors to lifechanging experiences. Mike believes that no matter what challenges lie ahead, he has been given the basic skills and hardened confidence to get ahead.

Mike helps other veterans by leading seminars planned to help them qualify for financial aid to continue their educations and to be successful in post-secondary programs. He believes leading seminars is more rewarding than "driving semis".

This is the second year in a row that an ETSU Veterans Upward Bound participant has won a NAVUBPP scholarship. The VUB staff congratulates Mike on his outstanding accomplishments!

First Graduate of Veterans Upward Bound's Spanish for High School Credit Program

Congratulations to Air Force retired veteran Susann Burniston from Mountain City, Tennessee for being the first Veterans Upward Bound student to complete the VUB Spanish for High School Credit Program. Susann retired April 1, 2002, and first enrolled in the program in August 2003. She completed the program August 2006 and will receive a high school transcript from Carter County School system to show proof of her completion of two years of high school foreign language.

You might ask, why did she need this transcript? In Tennessee, to graduate from any Community College or for those seeking a B.A. from any public four -year college or university, two years of foreign language (same language) is re-

quired to be taken in high school. Anyone who fails to meet this requirement and then decides to attend college, has to take the two semesters of freshman college foreign language to satisfy the high school deficiency. Since this program is free to veterans, in some cases, this could save up to six hours of college tuition. Also, taking a college-level foreign language could possibly delay college graduation.

On July 28, 2003, Veterans Upward Bound and Carter County Adult High School in Elizabethton entered an agreement where VUB students could enroll and earn high school credit in Spanish to satisfy high school foreign language deficiencies. Depending on the students' needs, they can earn one or two credits of high school Spanish. After completing the necessary requirements, the veteran receives a high school transcript from

Carter County as proof of completion.

Don't think you have to complete this program before you enroll in college. It is designed in such a way that a student can be dually enrolled in college and the Spanish for High School Credit Program. The only requirement by Tennessee is that you must have the high school deficiency completed before college graduation occurs. So check us out. The class meets every Saturday morning from 9 – Noon at the ETSU Nave Center in Elizabethton. Congratulations again, Susann, for being our first graduate. Well done!
