VUB Annual Banquet

VUB held its 27th Annual Banquet on December 6, 2007, in ETSU's D.P. Culp Center dining room. Program participants, and their guests, college achievers and graduates, supporters, and staff members attended the gala event to recognize, honor, and reward VUB participants and to celebrate another successful year. A delicious meal was served by ETSU's food service program to approximately fifty attendees.

Participants were recognized and presented with certificates of participation and Fall Semester 2007 grade reports. College placements and graduates were introduced and presented with a certificate and gifts. Scholarship winners and the Polly Archer

academic award finalists were announced. Rebecca Triplett, a recent graduate of ET-SU, was the Polly Archer award winner; Matthew Dorton, a junior at ETSU, was 1st runner-up; and Michele Martin, a junior at ETSU, was 2nd runner-up.

Len Morrison, VUB Assistant Director, provided the year's progress report which included:

- ♦all VUB yearly objectives were met or exceeded
- ♦ Students in all classes exceeded their performance goals by 18.5%

- ♦ Students in academic classes exceeded their performance goals by 14.2%
- ♦ Goals in the areas of program completion, college entrance, retention, and graduation were all exceeded
- ♦ The largest number of achievers (96) were enrolled in post-secondary programs during the academic year, and
- ◆Since the beginning of VUB in 1980, 609 veterans have entered programs of post-secondary education

Spring Semester Information

Page three of the newsletter contains the VUB 2008 Spring Semester schedule of classes. It is very similar to previous semesters and it contains all the pre-college class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for entrance into and be successful in a post-secondary program. Please note that some classes meet twice per week (computers, science, probability & statistics), while others meet only once per week (math, English, and literature). Also note that the semester is ten weeks in length, containing two five-week periods with a one-week break between the fifth and sixth week.

Check out the schedule and contact any VUB staff member if you have questions or need assistance. To register for classes follow the instructions at the bottom of the page. We recommend that all participants register for at least two courses so that you will re-

ceive the full benefit of the instruction and be better prepared when you enter a post-secondary program.

You may register by phone, by email, or you may remove page three, fold it so that the VUB address is on the outside, staple/tape it and mail it to us not later than January 21, 2008. There is no need for a stamp.

All participants who register for spring semester classes are invited to attend our orientation program which will be held on Thursday, January 24, 2008, at 5:00 P.M. in ETSU's Main Meal Private Dining Room on the 3rd floor of the D.P. Culp Center. We hope to see you there.
