VUB Student Wins Third Scholarship



ETSU Veterans Upward Bound extends congratulations to Army Veteran Michelle Martin for being the recipient of the 2008 Southeastern Association of Educational Opportunity Program Personnel (SAEOPP) Scholarship. This Scholarship in the amount of \$1,500 will be applied toward the 2008 Fall Semester.

The winning of this scholarship makes Michelle the recipient of three scholarships within the last year recommended by Veterans Upward Bound. She was also awarded \$400 by the Tennessee Association of Special Programs (TASP) and \$500 by the National Association of Veterans Upward Bound Project Personnel (NAVUBPP).

Michelle, currently a senior at ETSU, is seeking a double major in Criminal Justice and Sociology and has a 3.599 G.P.A. Her goal is to become a court advocate for victims of abuse to help them protect their rights and achieve justice.

Michelle has been a rescue squad volunteer, blood donor, academic tutor for young girls, has assisted with VUB orientation and college success seminars; was first runner-up for the 2007 VUB Polly Archer Academic Award; and has qualified for the ETSU Dean's list. By achieving academic excellence, she earned her mem-

bership in the Criminal Justice Society - Alpha Phi Sigma and the Non-traditional Student Adult Honor Society - Alpha Sigma Lambda.

Besides being a full time student, Michelle is a mother of four children and a grandmother. She has often stated that she wants to be a good example for her family by continuing toward her goal of a bachelor's degree. She continually reminds everyone she meets that if it was not for Veterans Upward Bound helping to develop her confidence and strength she would not be here today accomplishing her education goals.

Page three of the newsletter contains the VUB 2008 Summer Semester schedule of classes. It is very similar to previous semesters and it contains all the pre-college class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for entrance into and be successful in a post-secondary program. Please note that some classes meet twice per week (computers, science, probability & statistics), while others meet only once per week (math, English, and literature). Also note that the semester is nine weeks in length, containing one five-week period and one four-week period with a one-week break between the fifth and sixth week.

follow the instructions at the bottom of the page. We recommend that all participants register for at least two courses so that you will receive the full benefit of the instruction and be better prepared when you enter a post-secondary program.

You may register by phone, by email, or you may remove page three, fold it so that the VUB address is on the outside, staple/tape it and mail it to us not later than April 18, 2008. There is no need for a stamp.
