## Grants

- Submitted and was partially awarded Instructional Development Grant on the use of virtual reality in medical education. Funds will be used to purchase equipment and software and test VR technology with faculty and students.

- Successfully obtained National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NN/LM) Exhibit Award (\$1100) to fund providing consumer health information at the Remote Area Medical Clinic Gray, TN 2017.

The purpose of this display was to promote awareness of historical medical research abuses, educate future healthcare professionals about research ethics, and increase the library's available collections at the intersection of medicine, diversity, ethics, and history.
- As part of activities related to the Deadly Medicine exhibit at the Reece Museum, we also hosted a lecture at the Museum at Mountain Home, "Odd Nansen and the Nazis' Deadly Medicine" by Tim Boyce.
- Arranged and hosted SafeZone training at the Museum at Mountain Home to make it accessible for VA campus ETSU faculty; this training addresses LGBT+ populations and aims to increase faculty/staff awareness of LGBT+ issues and improve support for LGBT+ students.
