VUB Fall Semester Information and Instructions

All VUB participants who have not yet entered a program of postsecondary education and need some help preparing academically for that move are invited to review page three of this newsletter. You will find several pre-college class opportunities available that will help you bridge the academic gap between where you are and where you need to be as you enter college.

We will be changing our basic math and English classes this semester to tutoring for those who need to brush up on their basic skills. Please call the VUB office to arrange this individual service. Also, we will continue to provide tutoring for those who need additional preparation before taking the COMPASS test.

Please note that some classes meet twice per week (computer skills, science, probability & statistics), while others meet only once per week (math, English, and literature). Also note that the semester is ten weeks in length.

To register for classes, follow the instructions at the bottom of page three. You may register by phone, by e-mail, or you may remove the page, fold it so that the VUB address is on the outside, staple/tape it

and mail to us not later than September 6, 2011.

We recommend that all participants register for at least two courses so that you will receive the full benefit of the instruction and be better prepared when you enter a post-secondary program. We have designed the schedule so that you will be able to register for up to six different classes during a four-day period without class conflicts.

If you are in college already, keep us informed of your progress, call if you need help, and let us know if you change your address or phone number.

NAVUB Scholarship Winner



Shortly after his seventeenth birthday, Alan Koch dropped out of high school and joined the Marines. He enjoyed a great career in the Marines, having received his GED, earning numerous awards and citations, and advancing to the rank of master sergeant (E-8). His primary specialty in the Marines was combat engineer and nuclear ordnance technician.

After serving more than 24 years in the Corps he decided to retire and settle down in Mountain City, Tennessee. He had received a license to preach and while waiting to be called as a Southern Baptist pastor, he was contacted by the Veterans Upward Bound recruiter, Carl Cole, who convinced him to join VUB.

Not having received any formal academic training in more than 30 years,

Alan thought that it would be a good idea to sharpen his skills before attempting college. He was provided tutoring in math and English and completed the VUB pre-college preparation program.

Alan delayed his entry into college since he received an opportunity to pastor a small church in Johnson County. The VUB staff kept in contact with him, and in July of 2009, with encouragement and support, he decided the time was right to begin post-secondary education.

He entered Northeast State Community College in the fall of 2009 and has met with outstanding success, having completed 43 semester hours with a 4.0 GPA. He will continue his education at ETSU after graduating from NSCC.

Alan has received accolades from his professors as well as the VUB staff. He is reliable, sincere, positive, motivated and sets an impressive example for all to emulate.

We salute Alan for his success and congratulate him on winning the 2011 National Association of Veterans Upward Bound Program Scholarship worth \$500.
