Page three of the newsletter contains the VUB 2013 Spring Semester schedule of classes. It is very similar to previous semesters and it contains all the pre-college class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for entrance into and success in a post-secondary program.

We will continue our basic math and English classes this semester by offering tutoring for those who need to brush up on their basic skills. Please call the VUB office to arrange this individual service. We will continue to provide tutoring for those who need additional preparation before taking the COMPASS test.

Please note that some classes meet twice per week (computer skills, science, probability & statistics), while others meet only once per week (math II, English II, and literature). Also note that the semester is ten weeks in length.



We recommend that all participants register for at least two courses so that you will receive the full benefit of the instruction and be better prepared when you enter a post-secondary program. We have designed the schedule so that you will be able to register for up to six different classes during a four-day period without class conflicts.

Competition for the Polly Archer Academic Achievement Award, which was established in 1997, ended in a tie for first place honors this year. Congratulations to Brad Flynn, a USAF veteran and a full time Johnson City police officer, and Alan Koch, a retired USMC Master Sergeant (2009-10 winner).

Brad graduated from ETSU in May 2012 receiving a BSIS degree with a concentration in criminology, was on the Dean's list, maintained a 4.0 GPA, and graduated Magna Cum Laude. He is currently enrolled at ETSU pursuing a master's degree in Public Administration.

Alan graduated from Northeast State Community College receiving an AS degree in Religion and Philosophy, was on the President's List, maintained a 4.0 GPA, was

selected as Philosophy Student of the Year, awarded two scholarships, and graduated Summa Cum Laude. He is currently enrolled at ETSU pursuing a BS degree in Philosophy and Religious Studies.

For winning the Polly Archer Academic Achievement Award, both Brad and Alan received a Veterans Upward Bound Certificate of Achievement and a \$50 gift certificate. They were presented with an autographed book, *Freakonomics*, donated by coauthor, Stephen J. Dubner, who offered congratulations and a thank you for their service in the military. Additionally, their names are engraved on the Polly Archer plaque that is on permanent display in the VUB office.

Runners-up for the award are Dean Nash, USA retired, attending King College with a 4.0 GPA; and James Burniston, USAF retired, attending Watauga Baptist Bible College with a 4.0 GPA.

Participants Recognition Dinner



VUB held its 32nd Annual Banquet on December 6, 2012, in ETSU's D.P. Culp Center dining room with approximately 50 participants, guests, college achievers and graduates, program supporters, and staff in attendance. It was a special event to recognize and celebrate the achievement and progress of veterans who have chosen to continue their education.

Special guests included Ms. Sheryl Burnette, ETSU Registrar; Mr. Kevin Flanary, ETSU Assistant Registrar/Veterans Affairs Coordinator; Mr. Dick Shambaugh, Johnson City Vet Center Director, and his wife, Sue; Ms. Diane Tarlton and Ms. Carolyn Minton from the Johnson City Labor/Workforce Office; and Mr. Larry Nelson from the Veterans Affairs Office at Northeast State Community College. VUB Staff attending included Bobby Westbrook, counselor, recruiter, and tutor; Carl Cole, academic advisor, recruiter, and instructor; Greg Stout, instructor of computer skills, probability and statistics, and science; Joan Hathaway, executive aide; Teresa Carver, TRiO executive aide; and Len Morrison, director, instructor and tutor.

All VUB participants attending were recognized and presented with a Certificate of Appreciation and their fall semester grade report. Post-secondary college placements and graduates during Project Year 2011-2012 were also recognized. The annual academic award candidates were introduced and the winners were

announced (see article and pictures on page 1).

Veterans Upward Bound Director, Len Morrison, provided an update on activities and achievements which included:

- all VUB objectives were met or exceeded
- academic skills objective, as measured by a pre– and posttest was exceeded by 98%
- post-secondary placement objective was exceeded by 228%
- VUB program completion and retention objective was exceeded by 153%, and
- post-secondary persistence objective was exceeded by 121%.

Morrison reported that during the 2011-2012 Project Year, 41 veterans were placed into post-secondary representing all military branches. Enrollment in post-secondary schools at the end of the academic year was 203 veterans at 64 schools in 31 states and Washington, D.C. Also, 14 graduated post-secondary. The numbers of placements and graduates were all-time records for VUB.

To conclude the event, door prizes were provided to all who attended and each person received a choice of either a VUB cap, umbrella, or T-shirt.



Margie Jones Community Service Award



The first annual VUB Community Service Award was presented to Navy veteran Mary Dykes for her outstanding contribution and record of community service.

Mary graduated from ETSU in May of 2012 receiving a BS in Parks and Recreational Management with a minor in Appalachian Studies. She is currently enrolled at ETSU in the Masters of Liberal Arts in Archival Studies. While in the VUB Program she won two scholarships and was the winner of the 2010-2011 Polly Archer Academic Achiever Award.

Mary's community service involvement as an organizer and participant in numerous activities as well as an officer in committees, clubs and workshops is truly remarkable. As the winner of this award, Mary received a VUB Certificate of Appreciation, \$50 and an autographed book, *Freakonomics*.
