## **VUB Summer Semester Information and Instructions**

Page three of the newsletter contains the VUB 2014 Summer Semester schedule of classes. It is very similar to previous semesters and it contains all the pre-college class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for entrance into and success in a postsecondary program.

We will continue our basic math and English classes this semester by offering tutoring for those who need to brush up on their basic skills. Please call the VUB office to arrange this individual service. We will continue to provide tutoring for those who need additional preparation before taking the COMPASS test.

Please note that one class meets twice per week (computer skills), while the remainder meets only once per week (algebra and statistics). Also note that the semester is nine weeks in length.

Check out the schedule and contact any VUB staff member if you have questions. To register for classes follow the instructions at the bottom of the page. You may register by phone, by e-mail, or you may remove the page, fold it so that the VUB address is on the outside, staple/tape it and mail to us not later than April 25, 2014.

We recommend that all

participants register for at least two courses so that you will receive the full benefit of the instruction and be better prepared when you enter a post-secondary program.

We have designed the schedule so you will be able to register for up to five different classes during a four-day period without class conflicts.

If you are in college already, keep us informed of your progress, call if you need help, and let us know if you change your address or phone number. Have a great Summer!

Highlights of the conference included:



- VUB Legislation and Regulations Workshop by Julia O'Dell, VUB Director at the University of Kansas and Past-President of NAVUB.

Excellent presentations were also given by Matthew Fasciano, Chief Operating Officer of the Posse Foundation, and by Lt. Col. Alvin Phillips, U.S. Army, retired, who is currently serving as the Senior Vice President for Membership and Human Resources at the Council for Opportunity in Education.

Several presentations/discussions were led by VUB members who offered insight and recommendations for daily operations in VUB programs.

The traditional Eagle Luncheon at which NAVUB Scholarship winners and VUB Staff members were recognized and honored was a big success. Two of the 2013 NAVUB Scholarship winners, including ETSU's VUB Program winner David Baxter, were invited to speak at the luncheon. Both VUB participants related how their participation in VUB had helped them to navigate through the higher education process and provided outstanding support for their success as college students.

One \$2,000 scholarship and ten \$1,000 scholarships were awarded for the 2013 competition. Plans are to repeat this endeavor for the 2014 competition.
