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## **VUB Spring Semester Information and Instructions**

Page three of the newsletter contains the VUB 2015 Spring Semester schedule of classes. It is very similar to previous semesters and it contains all the precollege class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for entrance into and success in a postsecondary program.

We will continue our basic math and English classes this semester by offering tutoring for those who need to brush up on their basic skills. Please call the VUB office to arrange this individual service. We will continue to provide

tutoring for those who need additional preparation before taking the COMPASS test.

Please note that computer skills class meets twice per week, while the remainder (algebra, science, and stats) meets only once per week. Also note that the semester is 10 weeks in length.

Check out the schedule and contact any VUB staff member if you have questions. You may register by phone.

We recommend that all participants register for at least two courses so that you will receive the full benefit of the instruction and be better prepared when you enter a postsecondary program.

We have designed the schedule so you will be able to register for up to four different classes during a four-day period without class conflicts.

If you are in college already, keep us informed of your progress, call if you need help, and let us know if you change your address or phone number.

## 2015 - 2016 TRiO Programs' Scholarships

The 2015-16 TRiO Programs' annual academic scholarships for veterans began in late November 2014. The first competition to be announced was by the Southeastern Association of Educational Opportunity Program Personnel (SAEOPP) with submission date of December 15, 2014.

All VUB participants in college are considered for scholarships sponsored by three TRiO organizations: the National Association Veterans Upward Bound (NAVUB), the Tennessee Association of Special Programs (TASP), and SAEOPP. These three organizations allow and encourage one application from each VUB within their geographical areas.

ETSU VUB Staff continually reviews the academic records and other accomplishments of eligible participants expressing an interest in competing for the awards. The participant who best meets the selection criteria of the scholarship is the one who is nominated.

The ETSU VUB staff has nominated John Ryan Galyon, a second-year student at Northeast State Community College for the impending award.

Ryan has maintained an impressive GPA of 4.0 while at Northeast State and has participated in numerous activities. He has been very cooperative, determined, and has a positive attitude. He demonstrates professional demeanor and motivation to be successful.

Ryan received the highest recommendation from VUB and we wish him the best of success in the competition.

# From the Halls of Montezuma to the Shores of Tripoli: A Final Tribute to a Marine

Regardless of which service any veteran has serviced, when the familiar words, *From the halls of Montezuma to the shores of Tripoli* is heard, one knows it is all about the first-to-arrive hard-fighting spirit of the United States Marines. This article is about one of those Marines; MSgt Alan Koch, who passed away due to complications of cancer on December 9, 2014. Alan honorably served in the Marine Corps over 23 years. Following his retirement in January 2002, he and his family moved to Mountain City, TN.

I first met Alan in March 2002 when he was referred to VUB by the Johnson County Veterans Office. Alan immediately enrolled in our pre-college classes held in Mountain City. After a few months, he decided to put his schooling on hold and answer a calling from a local church in Johnson County to be their pastor. Not only was Alan a Marine, but also an Ordained Southern Baptist Minister. Little did he and I know, it would be seven years before he would call again.

Alan called me in the summer of 2009 to tell me he was ready to start Northeast State Community College we say for the last time our brother, Semper Fi!

for the fall to begin working on his associate degree in Philosophy and Religious Studies. While pastoring a church full-time, he started that fall and completed his associate degree in May 2012 with a 4.0 GPA. Along the way he was selected twice (2009-2010 and 2011-2012) for the ETSU Veterans Upward Bound Polly Archer Achievement Award, which recognizes a student's academic achievement for the previous academic year. Alan is the only VUB student to ever be selected twice. While at Northeast State, he was selected for the Honor Society, President's List for three semesters and chosen as the Philosophy Student of the Year for 2011-2012.

Upon graduating from Northeast State, Alan was awarded a full scholarship in Philosophy at ETSU where he started his bachelor's degree program in the fall of 2012. During the spring 2013 semester, he once again felt he was being called in a different direction and he left ETSU and enrolled into Liberty University in Virginia to finish his bachelor's degree and to seek a seminary degree. Toward the end of spring, his road took a different direction; he was diagnosed with cancer.

Alan bravely battled the disease the best he could but last month he went home to be with his Lord. Alan was a man of strong faith and never wavered or comprised his beliefs. He was in civilian life as he was in the Marines: first-to-arrive and a fighting spirit to the end. Alan, our comrade-in-arms will be missed but we know he's singing a new song, *From the halls of Montezuma to the Celestial Shores of Heaven*, so we say for the last time our brother, Semper Fi!
