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

Monthly Temperature Summary:


Average mean temperatures for July 2023 were close to normal (±1°F) for most areas of the state. The month started and ended hot, with most weather stations having their hottest day of the month on July 1 or 28. Through July there was only 1 record for daily high temperature, but there were 13 broken and 24 tied daily records for warmest low temperatures set. The Memphis National Weather Service Office (with a 35-year weather history) set a monthly record for warmest low temperature in July on July 1, with a low of 81°F, then they tied that new record the next day on July 2. Most areas of the state averaged 1-3°F warmer than normal for the first week of July, but then cooler conditions came in the middle of the month, with average temperatures 1-4°F below normal in the second week and 0-2°F below normal in the third week of July. Throughout the month there were 4 broken and 5 tied daily low temperature records, including a low of 39°F at the Mt LeConte COOP station in the Smoky Mountains on July 13. There were also 34 broken and 12 tied daily records for cool high temperatures set this month, with most of those recorded from July 8-10 and 19-21. Temperatures were close to normal for the 4th week of the month, before shooting up into the mid-to-upper 90s in the last days of July.

Monthly Precipitation Summary:

Storm systems brought heavy rainfall to parts of the state during the first half of the month, and then a more organized system brought widespread heavy rainfall to the state in the third week of July. In this week many areas of the state recorded over 2" of rain, with parts of the Cumberland Plateau recording over 5" of rain! Then the month ended dry with only light rainfall in most areas with the exception of some repeated storms in northeast Tennessee that led to higher totals. The heavy rainfall associated with the storms through the month of July produced flash flooding in various locations around the state. There were 35 new daily rainfall records set across Tennessee this month, including 11 records at weather stations with at least a 100-year weather history. Mt LeConte, Gatlinburg, and the Memphis airport weather stations all set daily rainfall records during July, each with over 4" of rain recorded. Two stations, the Mt LeConte COOP station (with a 35-year weather history) and the Mountain City 2 COOP station (with a 67-year weather history) both set records for the largest 1-day rainfall totals recorded in the month of July.


The Month in Comparison:


Comparing the average temperature and total precipitation for July 2023 to that of July in the previous 30 years at select automated weather stations located at airports across the state, this year's July temperature was close to average, but precipitation was a mix of above and below average. Memphis recorded their 3rd wettest July of the past 30 years and 4th wettest July in the city's 149-year weather history! Jackson and Nashville also recorded above average precipitation, while Chattanooga and Bristol/Tri-Cities recorded below average precipitation. Knoxville had an almost perfectly average July in both temperature and precipitation. Compared to the 30-year normals, Knoxville had an exactly normal temperature for July (78.5°F), and only 0.03" less than their normal July rainfall.
















Drought Monitor:

Several weeks of above normal precipitation in parts of the state led to major improvements in the U.S. Drought monitor in Tennessee over the month of July. The July 25, 2023 edition of the U.S. Drought Monitor showed that only 2.63% of the state was in Moderate Drought (D1), located in the northwestern corner of the state. This was a reduction of approximately 8.5% of the state's area in D1 compared to the 11.15% shown in D1 in the last Drought Monitor edition in June. There were also major reductions in Abnormally Dry (D0) conditions across the state, dropping from 35.41% of the state's area in the last release in June to just 6.99% of the state's area in the last Drought Monitor release of July. The only degradation of drought conditions this month was the addition of D0 in parts of northeast Tennessee.





Soil Moisture:

Overall most areas of the state had soil moisture levels that were within the normal range, with some areas of West Tennessee and southern Middle Tennessee having a monthly anomaly of 20-40mm below normal levels. Overall most areas of Tennessee saw increasing soil moisture levels, with the exception of a small part of far eastern Tennessee that had steady or slightly lowering soil moisture levels over the month. The USDA rated topsoil moisture as 2% very short, 16% short, 76% adequate, and 6% surplus, while subsoil moisture was 2% very short, 12% short, 81% adequate, and 5% surplus.

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
Streamflow:

Monthly averaged streamflow for July showed similar patterns to precipitation and the US Drought Monitor with most areas of the state recording normal or above normal streamflow levels, while several gauges in northeast Tennessee where the most below average precipitation occurred had below normal or much below normal streamflow levels.

July 2023






Miscellaneous:

Crop Conditions from USDA: Dry and hot conditions in the first parts of July led to stress on pastures and soil moisture, but rains in the second half of the month have improved conditions for most in the state. Most rain came in the form of storms and there was some reports of flooding and wind damage in crops across parts of the state this month. Second or even third cuttings of hay were being made in West and Middle Tennessee by the end of July. The winter wheat harvest finished by mid-July with very good to excellent yields reported. By the end of the month other crops had surpassed the 5-year average progress, and reported a majority of their crop in good or excellent condition.

Fire Danger: The Interagency Fire Center's significant wildland fire potential outlook for August shows that all of Tennessee and immediate surrounding areas have a normal potential for significant wildland fires in August, but the Piedmont regions of the Carolinas and central Georgia and southern Mississippi will have above normal potential for the month.



Story of the Month:

The main weather and climate story of July was the high number of severe thunderstorms which produced 8 reports of severe hail and 168 reports of severe wind damage. This was the highest amount of severe wind damage reports for the month of July in Tennessee since July 2016. More details on daily severe storm reports this month can be found in the Storm Reports section of this report. Also associated with these storms were numerous reports of flash flooding across the state.

An intense thunderstorm in Germantown (Shelby County) produced rainfall totals of over 3-inches in as short at 45 minutes, resulting in flash flooding on July 4.

A series of storms in the early-morning hours of July 14 impacted northeast Tennessee, with several roads closed, and bridges damaged due to flash flooding in Washington, Unicoi, and Carter counties where up to 4-inches of rain fell.

Potentially record-setting rainfall occurred in western Kentucky on July 18-19 where up to 10" of rain fell in less than 24-hours; portions of West and Middle Tennessee also received 4-6" of rainfall from the same storm system.

Several roads were closed around East Tennessee on July 20 due to flooding. Meigs and Fentress counties were heavily impacted and some roads in Pigeon Forge were closed. Highway 321/441 (The Spur) between Gatlinburg and Pigeon Forge, also in Sevier County, was closed temporarily due to a rock slide.



There were 13 days with severe storm reports during July 2023, with no reported tornadoes, 167 reports of severe wind damage, and 8 reports of severe hail (with a diameter of 1" or larger).

CPC Outlooks for the Next Month:

The NOAA Climate Prediction Center outlooks for August show that almost all of Tennessee is leaning towards warmer than normal conditions, with higher confidence for western and southern parts of the state. The far northeast corner of the state has equal chances for a normal, warmer, or cooler month. The northern and eastern portions of the state are also leaning towards a wetter than normal August, while the rest of the state has equal chances for normal, drier, or wetter than normal conditions.
