- 1. President Kathy Smith called the meeting to order at 2:35 p.m.
- 2. President Smith introduced Mr. Bill Coleman who gave a presentation and distributed a handout about the Consolidated Retirement Plan. He explained that employees now have the option to transfer into the State Plan. Patsy Leach addressed the Senate with the why and why not to transfer.


