CALL TO ORDER:

With a quorum present, President Steadman called the meeting to order at 2:45 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The minutes of the October 23, 2000 meeting were unanimously approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

NEW BUSINESS:

Tennessee Board of Regents Online Degree. Dr. Linda Doran discussed the proposed framework for the Tennessee Regents Web-based Degrees. She stated that TBR is moving forward rapidly regarding this program. The proposed TBR degree programs will include an associate degree designed for transfer to a university, an associate degree in Professional Studies and two bachelor's degrees in the following areas: (1) General Studies, and (2) Professional Studies (one of which will be Management Information Systems). Three committees have been formed to identify issues and concerns, propose program evaluation processes, and develop plans for campus evaluation. These committees are as follows: (1) Faculty, Curriculum and Institutional Issues, (2) Policies, Procedures and Student Support Services, and (3) Curriculum Approval. The committees are scheduled to submit recommendations shortly with implementation of a degree scheduled by Fall 2001. The degree proposal is to be submitted to TBR no later than the March 2001 Board meeting. Senators asked many questions related to the substance and procedure of this initiative. Steadman noted that TBR is putting substantial resources into this program and is aggressively pursuing the Fall 2001 implementation date. (For more information, contact Dr. Linda Doran at x9-4213)

ETSU Online BGS Degree. Dr. Norma MacRae addressed the Online BGS Degree at ETSU. After reviewing the target market regarding the program, she discussed the types of courses to be placed on-line for the initative. Other issues covered included support provided to faculty for course development, property rights to the courses and current status of the project. Dr. Ranker encouraged faculty to attend as OIT is actively seeking input regarding issues related to the multimedia rooms and the possible use of a campus pipeline.
